Briscoe Western Art Museum Presents Briscoe Blast! National Day of the Cowboy on July 23

SAN ANTONIO (July 19, 2016) – The Briscoe Western Art Museum hosts the 2nd annual *Briscoe Blast! National Day of the Cowboy* on Saturday, July 23 from 12 noon – 4:00pm. This FREE community event features live music, art-making activites, Museum tours, games, and an authentic Chuck Wagon all in celebration of the legendary cowboy and vaquero – cultural icons of the American West. The National Day of the Cowboy is a day set aside to celebrate and preserve the heritage of the American Cowboy/Cowgirl and *Vaquero* in the United States. "The cowboy archetype is a true American icon that transcends time, gender, ethnicity, and geographic boundaries," said Tom Livesay, executive director of the Briscoe Museum. "As an institution dedicated to the preservation of the art and heritage of the American West, it is only appropriate that we host this celebration of cowboy culture." In May 2015, Texas became the tenth state to pass the National Day of the Cowboy Commemoration.
