## Briscoe Western Art Museum Hosts 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Yanaguana Indian Arts Market

Family-Friendly Event Takes Place First Weekend in October

**SAN ANTONIO, TX** – The Briscoe Western Art Museum presents its annual **Yanaguana Indian Arts Market** on **Saturday, October 1** and **Sunday, October 2** offering visitors a glimpse into tribal tradition and contemporary Native culture. The market is a FREE community event featuring over 40 Native American artists showcasing and selling their handcrafted works of art, in addition to musical performances, dancing, storytelling, artist demonstrations of glassblowing, painting, printmaking, pottery, weaving, interactive art making, and Native American-inspired food. The **Yanaguana Market** and is scheduled from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm each day. Highlights include:

Leading up to the *Yanaguana Market*, the Briscoe Museum will host a FREE lecture on **Thursday**, **September 29 at 6:30pm** by **Dr. Adrienne Keene** (Cherokee Nation) on cultural appropriation and stereotypes of Native peoples in popular culture. As a Native scholar, writer, and activist, Dr. Keene will highlight the value and artistic integrity of authentic Native arts and discuss topics ranging from sports mascots, mass-produced "Indian-inspired" jewelry, and Halloween costumes. This lecture is part of the Briscoe's ongoing *Voices of the West:* Distinguished Lecture Series.

The Yanaguana Indian Marts Market is held in accordance with the Indian Arts & Crafts Act, a critical piece of legislation that protects Native artists and consumers; Market attendees are assured that what they purchase is authentic and that the materials used are of the highest quality.
